All 2014 Winners received their citations on Tuesday 28 October 2014 at **Hillcrest Christian College** in **Soldiers Road Clyde North**. After the awards ceremony the 310 children from 13 schools in attendance participated in the traditional signing ceremony. The YABBA Council thanks these authors and illustrators for donating their time on the day, we are truly honoured to have them in attendance and for their ongoing support. The YABBA Signing Ceremony is a tremendously important component of the day, so important that we need to expand Author and Illustrator participation. We need to build, develop and extend connections to our past winners, our Hall of Fame inductees and the next generation of Aussie Creators that will be crucial to our success in decades to come.

2014 Voting

The number of votes received is *still* the single biggest issue for the YABBA community. The awards are only successful with stakeholder participation. This means children recommending, reading, rating and rewarding their favourite Australian books through either their school or a public library.

YABBA worked tirelessly to ensure that **Every Child's Voice Counts** by using this key message in all member communications across the year. This brand will continue to be used in the coming years to remind all members that the voices of their students are incredibly important.



The YABBA Awards received votes from **15,597** children in 2014. This includes both direct and indirect votes for Australian books.

Funding and Sponsorship

The YABBA Council has worked diligently at collecting membership fees to fund the operation of the annual program. Funding has been used to run the website, disseminate publicity, thank authors and illustrators for attending the Awards Ceremony, and general operating costs.



In 2014 YABBA was successful in obtaining \$15,000 in grant funding from the Copyright Agency's Cultural Fund to conduct the **Children's Voices in Australian Literature – YABBA Ambassadors** project. The YABBA Council is very grateful to the Copyright Agency for their generous funding.

25 Authors and Illustrators visited 25 schools across Victoria, speaking to more than 3,500 students in schools that have had very few, if any, Author or Illustrator visits in the past 5 years. The Aussie Creators were asked to deliver their normal school visit with the inclusion of a component on the YABBA Awards. Where possible YABBA Council members attended the events with the YABBA Ambassadors, or the creator was provided a statement to read on our behalf



In 2014 the Council conducted a series of dedicated marketing programs to increase brand awareness and new member numbers, these initiatives included –


- Email campaigns to schools following a shortlist poster request

 Late in the year YABBA established a Facebook Page and an Instagram Account to further enhance the communications channels through which to deliver the YABBA message.


